Houston associate Meg Griffith has been selected by the Institute for Energy Law (IEL) to be part of their sixth annual Leadership Class. The IEL is one of the world's oldest continuing legal education providers. It presents several educational conferences and seminars each year, publishes papers and periodicals, and provides an important forum in which contemporary issues affecting the energy industries can be discussed.

Meg has a diverse practice of high-stakes, cutting edge litigation. The class will then continue through Spring 2024 with webinars, networking events, and other programming geared toward developing young energy professionals.
