

Susman Godfrey Elects New Managing Partner

Susman Godfrey has elected Vineet Bhatia a managing partner as the firm's long-time leader Neal Manne steps down from the role. Houston-based Bhatia joined Susman Godfrey in 1996 and is a long-serving member of the firm's executive committee. He has tried more than 25 cases to verdict or arbitration decision, many on behalf of Fortune 500 companies. Mr. Bhatia has been recognized as a Legend by Lawdragon, a Litigation Star by Benchmark Litigation and among the Best Lawyers in America for Excellence in Commercial Litigation. He is a graduate of Columbia Law School and clerked for the late Jack B. Weinstein of the Eastern District of New York.
